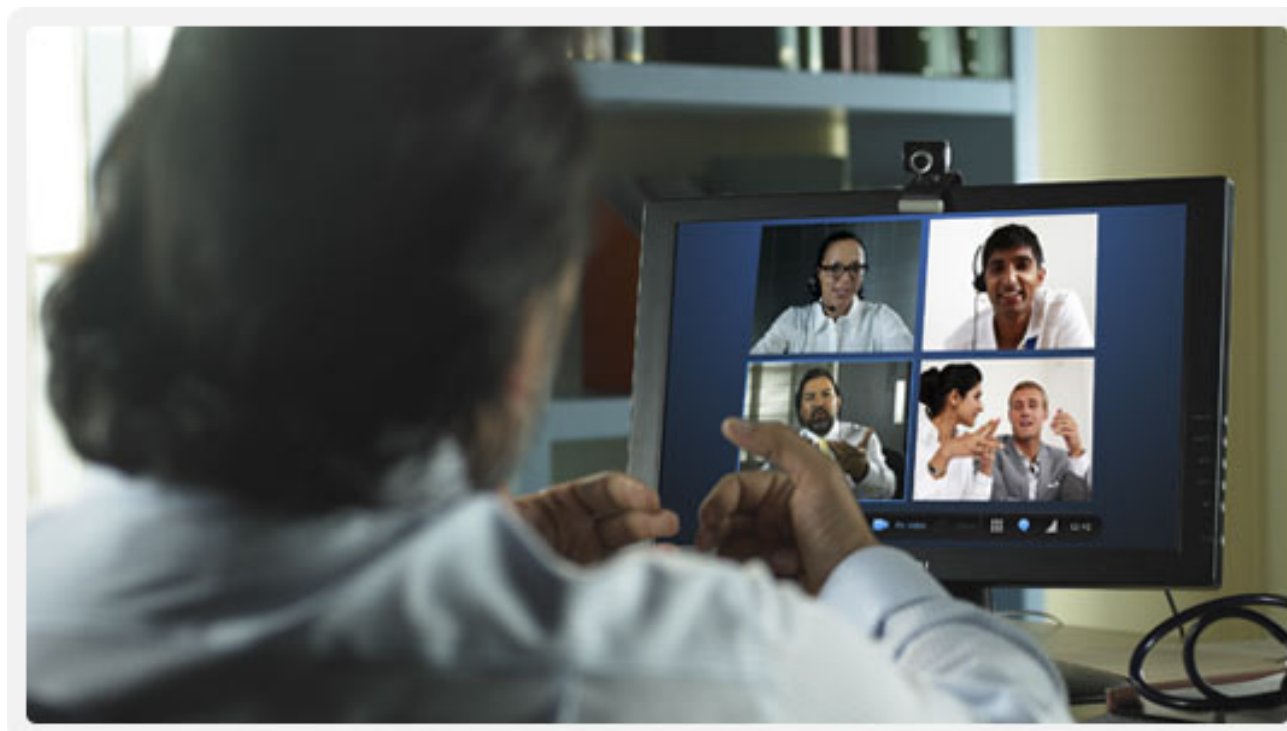


Group video calling

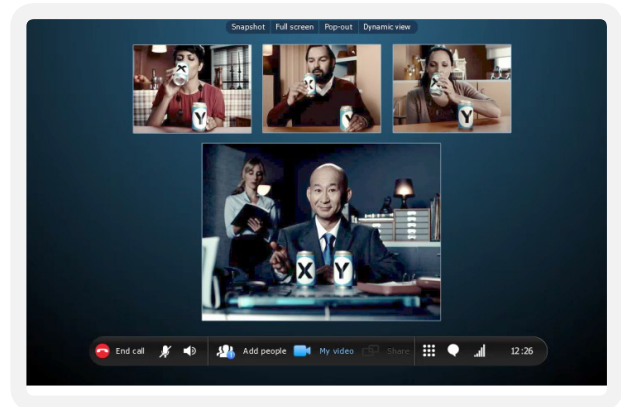

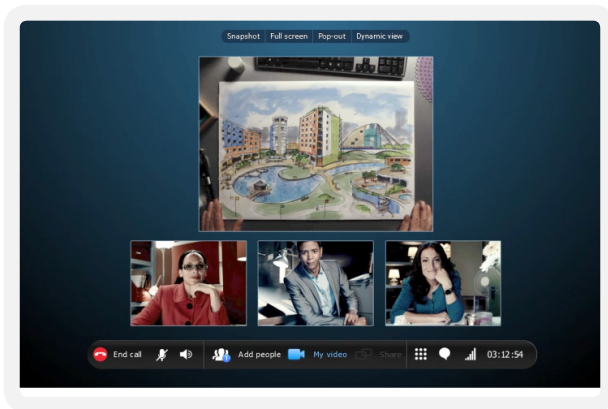

To experience the business benefits of group video calling for you or your company:

1. Download the latest version of Skype at skype.com/go/businessdownload.
2. Trial group video calling for 7 days.
3. Get group video calling:

- Skype Manager administrator**
1. Sign in to Skype Manager. Don't have Skype Manager yet? Go to skype.com/skypemanager and sign up now.
 2. Ensure that your employees have been added as members to your Skype Manager.
 3. Assign group video calling subscriptions to your members.

Skype Manager member Sign in to Skype and request group video calling from your Skype Manager admin.

Individual purchase Buy Skype Premium from skype.com/go/skypepremium.

Everyone on the call will need the latest version of Skype, a webcam and a broadband connection.

System requirements

Group video calls can be between three or more people (up to a max. of 10), and at least one person on the call needs a group video calling subscription. For the best quality, we currently recommend video calls with up to five people.

For group video calls with three people, we recommend a minimum connection of 2Mbps downlink, a Core 2 Duo 1.8 GHz CPU, a 128MB RAM, DirectX 9.0c (min) graphics card and 1GB of memory.

For group video calls with five people, we recommend a minimum connection of 4Mbps downlink, a Core 2 Duo 2.8 GHz CPU, a 128MB RAM, DirectX 9.0c (min) graphics card and 1GB of memory.

For group video calls with 7 or more people, we recommend a minimum connection of 8Mbps downlink, an Intel i7 CPU, a 256MB RAM, DirectX 9.0c (min) graphics card and 2GB of memory.
